VETERAN PHIL MILLER TO SPEAK ON MEMORIAL DAY



Phil Miller attended the U of M for 3 years before enlisting in the Army in 1966. After 3 years (one in Vietnam), he returned to the U of M and earned a BS in agriculture. He worked several years (Kraft Foods and Northrup King) before

starting a small ag business in SW Minnesota. In 1981 he reenlisted and joined the National Guard. In 1983 he went into active duty as a trainer in the ARNG. He retired in 1999. He and Ana moved to Browerville and built a home. He then attended CLC for Criminal Justice and graduated with honors. He worked for Wadena Police Dept. for 2 years and Todd County Sherrif's Dept. for 8 years. After retiring again, they moved to Staples and still reside there. Phil is active with a side business of 40+ years, Southwest Explosives. In the summer they live near the golf course and winters are spent in Port Aransas, TX.

BELL TOWER



The Bell Tower will be dedicated on Memorial Day. It was recently completed by metal sculptor Jeff Kreitz. The tower houses our 100+ year old bell from an NP steam locomotive. The design emphasizes our railroad history and the Railroad-Military linkage during WWII. A remote controlled electronic ringer was added.

HONORING OUR VETERANS

SERGEANT ROGER D. JENSEN




Roger Dale Jensen was born in Staples, August 7, 1948. He graduated from Staples High School in 1967. He was drafted in the Army in May 1968 and received basic training in Fort Campbell, KY. From there he was assigned to Fort Lewis, WA. In October he was sent

to Vietnam as an infantryman. He served with D Co, 2nd BN 1st Infantry, 196th Infantry BDE, Americal Div. On June 28, 1968 he died as a result of wounds received in action in Quang Nam Province, Vietnam. He was wounded while

on a combat operation when a hostile force was encountered. He expired shortly after being admitted to a military medical facility. He was only 20 years old and had only 115 days remaining in his tour. Roger was posthumously promoted to E5 Sergeant. He received the Purple Heart, Viet Nam Campaign Medal, Viet Nam Service, National Defense Service Medal, Americal Division Unit Patch and the Combat Infantry

Badge. His name is forever engraved on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall in Washington DC.















SERGEANT E5 GARRY CARPENTER



Garry grew up in Staples and graduated from Staples High School in 1964. He enlisted with John Greig, Huck Holst, Bob Blessing and Boone Smith. This guaranteed they would go through basic training together and then on to San Diego, CA. Garry

reported to Camp Pendelton, CA for advanced training and then on to Hawaii assigned to the first Marine Brigade Amphibious Tractor Battalion, which was sent to Vietnam. The LVT he was driving, was struck by an anti-tank landmine on the beach south of Chu Lia. Garry went in to aid an unconscious Marine when a second explosion occurred. Garry received severe burns and was treated at the Army hospital in Okinawa. Garry earned a Bronze Star, combat "V" medal and a Purple Heart for his heroism.

He finished his enlistment in Camp Lejeune NC. and then moved back to Minnesota and worked

for 3M in Hutchinson. He and his wife Karen returned to Staples. He completed Machine Trades program at the vocational school. For several years he had a career in machine maintenance at Stern Rubber.

They have 2 children, 4 grandchildren and a 3 great grandchildren. Garry continues to deal with the effects of war. He has PTSD and Agent Orange cancer and a stroke syndrome due to vasculitis phenomena. Garry has sacrificed much, and is still very proud to have served his country.


